Renewal Project Update

You may not have noticed much change when visiting the Library recently, but the Library's Renewal Project is well underway. This past December, the Connecticut State Bond Commission voted to forward our project, and in March we officially signed a contract with the State of Connecticut to receive the promised \$1,000,000 grant. In the meantime, the Library Board of Trustees voted to the architectural engage services of TSKP Studio to complete the design and the construction plans. After working collaboratively this past winter to finalize the design, in late April we began developing the final construction documents and selecting furnishings and finishes. More recently, we have started strategizing with Burlington Construction, our construction management firm, to lay out the construction timeline and determine how best to maintain Librarv operationsduringconstruction. At this point, we anticipate beginning work on the building in September and completing the project by next summer. Stay tuned!
