While we are proud of the services we provide, we are confident we can do more to better meet the needs of the community. Last year, we welcomed over 43,000 visitors through our doors, provided space for over 200 community meetings, fielded over 3,800 reference questions, checked out more than 69,000 print and digital items, and hosted 349 events attended by over

7,000 people. But we need to do more. The Renewal Project goals include, among others, providing more and better study and meeting spaces, more up-to-date collections, more programming to educate and entertain, and fine-tuning our services to meet the immediate and long-term needs of the community.

A vital part of achieving these goals and realizing our mission is creating a fit-for-purpose facility, which is why we've focused our efforts on the

building renovation these past few years. We're so pleased to be making progress on this phase of the project, and we're looking forward to sharing our new spaces with you in the months to come. Renewal Project & Building Updates are well underway

You've been hearing about it since Fall 2016, and it's finally happening! Starting in late October/early November, Renewal Project construction will begin in the Library. In fact, you may have already noticed some changes. In late August the BookCellar closed for business while it moved to a temporary location at 44 Lyme Street. Then, in September, movers began to pack away the Library's artwork for safekeeping during construction.

Work on the building will be conducted in phases over the course of 2020. The first phase will focus on the lower level, where the BookCellar is located, along with the new staff offices and storage spaces. Phase II

will be much more noticeable as we work on revamping the Children's & Young Adult Rooms. While services will undoubtedly be affected at times, the Library will remain open for the duration of the renovation, scheduled to be complete in Summer 2020.

The Renewal Project is a multi-year project to re-evaluate and re-imagine library services and plan for the future. The project is the natural outcome of the Library's 2015 long-range planning process and development of a new mission—to inspire lifelong learning and discovery in a welcoming place with exceptional resources, programs, and services.
